History of Paulding County Carnegie Library

The library was open for business on March 3, 1916, with 4000 books. The building was constructed of fireproof and slow burning materials, French gray pressed brick and Indiana Bedford stone with a green tile roof. The architects were Howard and Merriam of Columbus, Ohio. These architects also designed the Hayes Presidential Library in Fremont, Ohio.

The library was placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1985. In 2003 the library received an Ohio Bicentennial Historical marker in recognition of it being the first county library funded by the Andrew Carnegie Foundation.

Library Card

Returning/Renewing Materials

PCCL materials can be returned or renewed at any PCCL location. For a complete list of PCCL Branch libraries, visit mypccl.org.

Specialty materials, such as HOTSPOTS and other designated materials must be returned to the location specified when the material is checked out.

Digital checkouts (eBooks and other eMedia) are returned automatically.

Wireless Services

Wi-Fi is available at all locations during business hours. After hours, Wi-Fi is available to patrons in parking areas near the library/branch. A library card and pin is needed for access.

Hotspots

Mobile hotspots are available to patrons who are 18 years of age or older, have a valid Driver's License/State ID and Library Card in good standing, with a current address and working phone number on file.

Mobile Hotspots may be checked out for 14 days with Check outs on Friday and Saturday considered on special loan from the previous Thursday and will be due 14 days from that Thursday.

An agreement must be signed at the time of checkout stating that you understand the guidelines and will abide by what you have read.

Searching for ancestry can be a great adventure. The extensive collection at the Paulding County Carnegie library can help you get started.

Included in the collection is an obituary card file, cemetery records, birth records, family records and much more.

Researchers also find the <u>Hayes Obituary Index</u> a useful online-tool.

Notary Services

Free notary service is available during the library's hours of business at Main and the Antwerp Branch. Notary publics are on staff, but schedules vary; please call ahead to confirm availability and details on what can be notarized. Nothing can be notarized during the last hour before the library closes.

Ohio law requires that the person signing the document must appear in person and present proper identification.

STORYTIMES

Storytimes introduce young children to the excitement of books, allow them to gather and interact as a group and also provides ideas for parents and caregivers to try at home when reading aloud to their child. The parent/caregiver is the child's first reading teacher. Children's librarians are part of that early literacy partnership.

BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

For over twenty-five years, the Paulding County Carnegie Library (PCCL) has sponsored and coordinated a county-wide reading competition called Battle of the Books. Fifth and sixth-grade teams made up of up to six students read twenty-five books and are then quizzed during a competition first at the school level and then at the county level for the championship. Each school library receives up to ten new books each year.
